Amazing Year 12 Results

On behalf of the College community, we congratulate the Year 12 Class of 2021 on their exceptional South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) results.

We again had 100% South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) completion rate, as has been the case for many years at Mount Carmel College.

Some of the highlights include:

- 100% SACE completion again
- Emannuel De Los Santos was Dux for 2021 with an ATAR of 98.35, closely followed by Jay Dizon with 98.30
- 9 Merits awarded to Mount Carmel College students.
 A Merit is awarded by the

- SACE Board to a student who demonstrates exceptional achievement in the subject.
- Just over 10% of all students received a Merit. Very few schools can make a similar boast.
- 16 students achieved an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 80 or more.
- Over 30% of all grades were A grades
- 99.4% of all grades awarded were C- or higher
- No E grades awarded to any of our students.
- 94% of those who applied for university have received an offer in the first round. Of those offered a place, 74% were offered their first preference in the first round of offers.

We are very proud of the outstanding results achieved by our Year 12 students. We know that excellent academic achievements are the result of a lot of hard work and the wonderful partnership in learning between the student, parents, teachers, support staff and the College.

COVID Safety Practices

We continue to follow SA Health directives in regard to safe practices. Parents are asked to ensure that they notify the College of any change of email address as important COVID information is sent to the parents' email addresses that we have on our system.

Congratulations to our Students

All our students, those who attended face to face in the first 2 weeks, and those remote learning, have shown remarkable skill at adapting to the circumstances. We all recognise that this was a very undesirable start to the new school year, but most students have made the best of it. We were delighted to welcome back all students at the start of this week.

Currently many restrictions are still in place for schools, including parents not coming into the school grounds, inter-school sport halted until week 5, no large gatherings of students, no excursions, no camps etc.

Student Supervision

As a school we have what the law defines as a duty of care towards the students enrolled. While the courts recognise that accidents cannot be totally prevented, schools are charged with the responsibility of ensuring the type of supervision which a normal parent would provide, considering the age of the student and the activity in which she is engaged.

I remind parents and students about several points which arise from the school's duty of care:

- Students will be supervised on the Primary Campus before school from 8:25 am and after school until 3:20 pm.
- Students will be supervised on the Secondary Campus before school from 8:05 am and after school until 3:20 pm.
- 3. Students are supervised at recess and lunch times.
- 4. When dismissed in the afternoon, students are expected to leave the school grounds immediately and proceed directly home. Students staying for activities organised by the school, such as sport or drama practice, will be supervised.
- 5. If a student is late or absent it is the responsibility of Parents/Guardians to notify the College before 9:00 am. To do this, a text message can be sent to 0438 368 846

and include student name, Class Teacher/Pastoral Care Teacher, reason for lateness/ absence and the date. This number is only available for text messaging. If the College has not been notified of an absence or late arrival by 9:00 am, a text message will be sent to parents/ guardians advising them that the student is not at school. This occurs each day starting at approximately 10:15 am. It is the responsibility of a parent/ guardian to provide current and updated mobile numbers to the College to ensure this process is maintained.

These measures ensure that both parents/guardians and staff are able to exercise their legal responsibilities for the students in a way that ensures a responsible degree of safety.

From the Deputy Principal, Secondary Campus



It was certainly a blessing to see all the students return on Monday, the 14 February. Whilst we are still restricted in our ability to hold school events, we have a great deal to celebrate when we can again meet as a college community. The outstanding achievements of the Year 12 Class of 2021 will be at the top of the agenda. The college is proud of the achievements of all our students and the Year 12 results certainly gave witness to the hard work and dedication that was put in over a number of years.

In summary, we again had 100% SACE achievement, over 30% A Grade results at Stage 2, 16 A+ results and 8 merits. The significance of these results cannot be overstated. Our 2021 cohort of students were in an elite category in terms of the state, and we have solidified our standing amongst the top group of schools.

Unfortunately, the Academic Assembly that was scheduled for later this month cannot go ahead because of the current restrictions. It was also disappointing to see that the SACE Merit Assembly at Government House was also cancelled. Given the significance of our results in 2021 we are determined to have a celebration later in the year once the restrictions have been lifted.

Attendance at School Matters

In a recent publication by the Australian Institute of Teaching and School Leadership titled 'Attendance Matters' they refer to research that has been conducted on the impacts of school attendance and student achievement. The study revealed that;

'Non-attendance has a variety of effects on students, both academically and socially. Absenteeism can increase social isolation, including alienation and lack of engagement with the school community and peers, leading to emotional and behavioural difficulties'.

Attendance at school is a habit and the discipline that it teaches our students will help them later in life when they join the workforce. We ask that we all work in continued partnership to support our students to understand this important life lesson.

Uniform

We remind our students and our parents of the importance of supporting our college policies. One such expectation is the way in which our students present themselves and wear their uniform with pride. If you are unclear about any aspect of the uniform, please refer to the college diary where it is clearly explained. The uniform policy

sets the standard for the way in which our students present themselves to the wider community.

Homework

A reminder to parents that if you have concerns about the amount of homework that your child is doing at home, please communicate this to the college. It is important that our students lay the groundwork at this time of the year. A reminder that our Year 12 students should be well under way with their Research Project. This must be completed by the end of this semester, and we will give our Year 12 students every opportunity and support to meet the deadline.

WELCOME

Firstly, welcome all to Mount Carmel College R-12 2022, especially to our new families. Our Finance Team would also like to welcome Tanya Weber who will be predominately located at our Primary Campus.

SCHOOL FEE STATEMENTS

With the amalgamation we are finalising the transfer of all Primary Campus statements to Mount Carmel College. Thank you to all those families who have contacted me to arrange payment plans, School Card Applications and Catholic Primary Sibling Discount forms, it is appreciated.

Statements will be issued within 2 weeks and I thank you for your patience and understanding whilst I work towards finalizing them. When you receive your statement please check that all information is correct and please refer to our 2022 Fee Schedule (recently uploaded) on our website for further detailed information which may have relevance to your family. Any anomalies noticed on your statement, please contact me as soon as possible so it can be addressed. Our checks have tried to minimize this occurring but as you can appreciate we may have overlooked something and seek your assistance.

BPAY

Secondary Campus BPAY Biller Code is 297846

This Biller code replaced obsolete Mount Carmel College BPAY Biller code of 46698 in May 2020. Any families still using out of date Biller Code 46698 are asked to update your payment plan to reflect this for future payments to us please. Any payments still being used with the old biller code will be rejected from March 2022 onwards.

Primary Campus

Parents/Guardians who used BPAY as a payment plan, you will need to update your current BPAY payment plan using Mount Carmel College Biller code of 297846 and your new reference number that is on your Mount Carmel College R-12 statement. In the interim, you may email me requesting your BPAY details and I will attach and forward your statement with your new BPAY information.

OKR

We are aware that the Primary Campus had the option of making electronic school fee payments by QKR. This payment method is no longer available so please make arrangements to use an alternative payment method such as BPAY, Direct Debit, Credit Card (FAT ZEBRA) and/or Centrepay. All forms are available on our website to access or contact me for assistance.

PRIMARY CAMPUS PAYMENT PLANS

Where possible all active/current payment plans during January 2022 have been transferred over to Mount Carmel College from Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish School banking system.

Where an existing payment plan was already in place at both campuses and provided it was the same date, frequency and account number it was combined and will be processed as such. If not, it was transferred but kept separate as it was originally arranged.

This year in particular, new payment plans will need to be arranged regardless of what you had in place last year.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY CAMPUS

New Payment plans need to be completed and lodged annually

unless it has no end date. They are not automatically renewed.

If you have a payment plan with no end date you need to review your plan annually and complete and lodge a new payment plan if required, to ensure your account is paid in full as per our Fees Policy, by 30 November.

SCHOOL CARD

Successful School Card applicants automatically receive Tier 2 lower fee structure. School Card application is made online (preferred) or you can lodge a hardcopy as soon as possible. Anyone who was eligible last year or new families commencing this year who provided me with a copy of their Centrelink card along with \$50.00 Acceptance of Offer payment will automatically have Tier 2 fees applied, but it is still a requirement to complete an Application form.

NAPLAN – privacy collection notice

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) takes place each year for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 and has been an everyday part of the school calendar since 2008.

NAPLAN helps parents, carers and educators to see if children are meeting important numeracy and literacy standards.

Collection of personal information

Schools are required by law to collect personal information about you and your child, irrespective of whether your child participates in NAPLAN testing.

The purpose of this notice is to advise parents and carers of how your child's personal information will be used for NAPLAN testing (both online and paper tests) in 2022 and, as part of NAPLAN Online, readiness activities scheduled at various times leading up to the test in May 2022.

NAPLAN testing

Since its introduction in 2008, NAPLAN testing has been conducted using paper-based tests for students in all year levels. NAPLAN paper tests are administered every year across a 3-day test window in the second full week of May.

In July 2013, Australian education ministers agreed to guiding principles for national online assessment. The move to NAPLAN Online started in 2018. Moving online means NAPLAN is transitioning from paper-based tests to computer-based assessments.

Online testing brings many benefits and opportunities including providing better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information.

Schools in South Australia will conduct NAPLAN testing online in 2022.

Readiness testing activities

A critical step in preparing for NAPLAN Online is schools' participation in readiness testing activities.

The purpose of readiness testing activities is to ensure your child is familiar with their device and the online test environment, as well as to test school and national infrastructure systems and processes.

Readiness testing is not another NAPLAN and will not formally assess students who participate in the test. Any reports generated will be used for testing purposes only. Readiness testing activities may involve students who are participating in NAPLAN in 2022.

Disclosure of personal information

For every student participating in NAPLAN Online testing and readiness activities, personal information will be uploaded by the Department for Education, as the Test Administration Authority (TAA), to the NAPLAN Online Assessment Platform ('assessment platform'). This information is listed over the page.

The information below marked with an asterisk (*) is also provided by the department, as the TAA, to FUJIFILM Data Management Solutions Pty Ltd for the purposes of printing paper test materials and reporting student results. FUJIFILM Data Management Solutions Pty Ltd ("FUJIFILM") is subject to rigorous information privacy and data security obligations under its contract with the Department for Education and is only
