# Student Absences/ Late Arrivals

When a student is absent or going to be late, parents should notify the school by 9am on that day by texting the Absentee Line on 0438 368 846 (SMS) or phoning (08) 8447 0500. You will need to state the following:

NAME OF CHILD YEAR LEVEL REASON FOR ABSENCE eg If late approximately what time will your child arrive etc.

A medical certificate is required if a student is away for more than 3 days. For any planned extended absence, a letter to the Principal is required to explain circumstances.

Although university, study and work meant that not all award winners could attend, our Dux Assembly was an acknowledgement of all students who achieved their SACE (100% of our students achieved their SACE) but also the outstanding students who achieved an A+ in a subject, the 9 Merits awarded by the SACE Board to our students for being at the absolute top level in their subject and the students who achieved a high ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank), placing them in the top performing students from across Australia.

Our Dux Award is named in honour of Sr Joan Barry and was won by Jose Emmanuel De Los Santos. Sr Joan passed away earlier this year in January, at the wonderful age of 99 and three quarters. Sr Joan, was Principal of this school from 1981 to 1988. Sr Joan made it a co-educational school in 1983 and changed its name from Mount Carmel Girls Secondary School to Mount Carmel College.

Mrs Pam Ronan was our guest speaker, giving the inaugural Sr Joan Barry address. For over 35 years Pam Ronan has worked in schools, TAFE and the University sector in South Australia. Pam Ronan is a member of the SACE Board, and a recipient of the Mary MacKillop Medal from the Australian College of Education for outstanding contributions to rural education. Pam has been Principal of two R-12 Catholic schools and a Principal Consultant for the Catholic Education. Pam reminded all of us of the connection of each person with our motto "Love and Dignity" via the 3 stars on our crest. Pam inspired students with her talk about excellence coming from productive struggle - sometimes we don't know what the end result will be. We need to put in the effort to achieve excellence. You must work hard for vourself even when the end result is not clear.

## **Important Information...**

#### STUDENT SUPERVISION

As a school we have what the law defines as a duty of care towards the students enrolled. While the courts recognise that accidents cannot be totally prevented, schools are charged with the responsibility of ensuring the type of supervision which a normal parent would provide, considering the age of the student and the activity in which they are engaged.

I remind parents and students about several points which arise from the school's duty of care:

- Students will be supervised on the Primary Campus before school from 8:25 am and after school until 3:20 pm.
- 2. Students will be supervised on the Secondary Campus before school from 8:05 am and after school until 3:20 pm.
- 3. Students are supervised at recess and lunch times.
- 4. When dismissed in the afternoon, students are expected to leave the school grounds immediately and proceed directly home.
  Students staying for activities organised by the school, such as sport or drama practice, will be supervised.

5. If a student is late or absent it is the esponsibility of Parents/Guardians to notify the College before 9:00 am. To do this, a text message can be sent to 0438 368 846 and include student name, Class Teacher/Pastoral Care Teacher, reason for lateness/ absence and the date. This number is only available for text messaging. If the College has not been notified of an absence or late arrival by 9:00 am, a text message will be sent to parents/ guardians advising them that the student is not at school. This occurs each day starting at approximately 10:15 am. It is the responsibility of a parent/ guardian to provide current and updated mobile numbers to the College to ensure this process is maintained.

These measures ensure that both parents/guardians and staff are able to exercise their legal responsibilities for the students in a way that ensures a responsible degree of safety.





## TRY-A-TRADE CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

One of the key signature programs of the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB) is Dooways2Construction (D2C), an industry-supported secondary schools' program that provides career education and Flexible Industry Pathways (FIP) courses to attract students to a career in the Building and Construction Industry.

CITB has supported the delivery of programs within D2C for many years to provide students with exposure to various construction trades, especially those with low uptake of apprenticeships. CITB is now expanding their support for programs to assist students in making informed decisions about entering a D2C FIP course in building and construction and any other pathways supported by CITB by introducing Try-A-Trade Construction Program.

Western Technical College (WTC) is now offering students the opportunity to participate in a 5-day Try-A-Trade Construction Program covering the areas of Carpentry, Bricklaying, Tiling and Paving. In addition, the program will include learning and obtaining a White Card, all delivered by TAFE SA.

Try-A-Trade Construction Program is designed to:

- Assist students to achieve the VET Readiness (VETRO) requirements, by supplying a certificate of participation
- Introduce students to career pathways in the Building and Construction Industry
- Enhance students learning and increase exposure to trade areas that students may be unfamiliar with and that have low uptake of apprentices
- Prepare students for entering a Building and Construction Flexible Industry pathways course such as the Certificate II in Construction Pathways
- Establish and encourage links between schools, students and Registered Training Organisations

- 4. Fill out the form

Please note, there is a student management
and Personal Protective Equipment fee of \$130.00

Special requirements: Students must adhere to
all safety requirements as directed by their lecturer.
The approved Personal Protective Equipment will be required during all training, including White Card. Students will need to purchase beige/black steel cap boots and beige work trousers before commencement at their own cost.
