The four-year journey of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia will reach the second, and final, assembly from 3-9 July 2022. At the assembly, the 277 Council Members will consider the motions that have emerged from that national journey, with the goal of renewing the life and mission of the Church in Australia.

School Fees for 2023

We are pleased to inform our school families that there will be no increase in school fees for the 2023 school year.

As South Australians continue to feel the impact of COVID-19, Catholic Education SA has announced it will freeze fees at its 86 Diocesan schools for the 2023 school year.

"These decisions are part of our continued COVID 19 response as we seek to support families at a time when they are being impacted by rising costs and inflation," says Dr Neil McGoran, Director, Catholic Education SA. Since 2019, Catholic Education SA has been implementing the Making Catholic Education More Affordable Initiative to ensure our schools are accessible to any family who wants their child to have a Catholic education.

Dr Neil McGoran said the fee-freeze would not impact the quality of education.

"We're committed to keeping school fees as low as possible and ensuring a Catholic education is affordable and accessible to all."

In addition to the fee-freeze, further fee remissions are available to any family






Business Excursion to Barossa Valley



On Monday 4th July the Stage 2 Business Innovation students

embarked on the inaugural excursion to investigate the main street of Tanunda and interview the business owners to answer the burning question "How have businesses in a country town coped with COVID and what transformations have they made?"

The day started with a 50-minute ride in the MCC school bus driven by Mr John Harker along the northern expressway to Tanunda main street where we perused the Information Centre first to get our bearings and collect any relevant brochures. The employee there was very friendly and gave us some insights into which businesses would be open on a Monday, so our plans had to change from our original itinerary. We walked the main street and collected data on the types of shops and stopped in at Beans and Cream to get some insights firstly by Emily Clunes who did the interviewing. Then onto Fruchocs where the lovely Tamika gave us a guided tour and answered some questions for Jessica Troung to record, collecting some free samples before heading back out into the cold Barossa morning. Wohlers was the next stop to get out of the cold and the students could not believe the amount of merchandise that they had in there!

After realizing that the 50s diner did not open until 12 noon, we decided to have a recess break at the Apex bakery and the sausage rolls went down well! Then it was back to the hub to take the bus to Maggie Beers, as our original plan of the Barossa Chocolate Factory was not going to happen due to not being open. The farm shop and surrounds were interesting but very busy and so not wanting to hang around too long we headed to Seppeltsfield Road to let Mr Harker show us how the drone technology could be used and may be a transformation idea that some of the businesses could take on board. Taking some great shots, we finally headed back to the 50s Diner for lunch and so that Jess could get another interview done. After a swing past the Tanunda Bakery so Aeron could complete his interview there, we cruised up to Menglers Hill to get another perspective of the surrounds. Then it was back in the bus for a 50-minute trip back to school.

All the businesses we encountered were very friendly and happy to answer the students' questions about their businesses and we will be hoping to plan another similar trip next year with Business Innovation students, as this year they enjoyed the day and learnt a lot about country life and business.

Year 3 Japanese Cultural Activity

The **Tanabata Festival** in Japan celebrates an old love story about a weaver princess and a cattle herder. In the story, they are allowed to meet only once a year, on 7 July (or 7 August in some parts of Japan), so many people celebrate their reunion on this day. The two characters in the story represent two stars in the Milky Way so Tanabata is also called the **'Star Festival'**.

If you are in Japan for *Tanabata* you will see lots of colourful decorations, including coloured strips of paper called *tanzaku* which are hung up on bamboo. Traditionally, people would write a wish on *tanzaku* to pray for Orihime and Hikoboshi's reunion. Now many people write their own personal wish on *tanzaku* too.

Our Year 3 classes made their paper star *tanzaku* for the *Tanabata* Festial as well as wrote their personal wishes on it.
