

































Year 10 History - Holocaust Excursion



As part of the 10 History curriculum students study World War II. A new museum

was opened in 2020 in Wakefield Street around the Holocaust, and on Wednesday 24 August Mr Zammit and myself, took a group of students to investigate this amazing resource. After completing a 150-word persuasive argument convincing me that it would benefit their studies, 16 students were selected to attend.

The day started with the group being divided into two; one group doing some primary source analysis activities and questions and the other doing the Holocaust static museum tour for about 30 minutes and then they swapped over. They worked collaboratively to find information and answer questions related to each of the 6 South Australian Survivors.


After this we were very privileged to hear from a Holocaust Survivor


