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

Student Absences/ Late Arrivals

When a student is absent or going to be late, parents should notify the school by 9am on that day by texting the Absentee Line on 0438 368 846 (SMS) or phoning (08) 8447 0500. You will need to state the following:

NAME OF CHILD, YEAR LEVEL, REASON FOR ABSENCE *eg If late approximately what time will your child arrive etc.*

A medical certificate is required if a student is away for more than 3 days. For any planned extended absence, a letter to the Principal is required to explain circumstances.

For any planned extended absence, state government legislation requires a parent to send a letter or email to the Principal, via <u>registrar@mcc.catholic.</u> <u>edu.au</u> seeking permission to be absent from school.

CELEBRATION OF SAINT MARY MACKILLOP FEAST DAY

Mary MacKillop died in 1909 in Sydney at the age of 67. Mary's influence on education and bringing God to the people, especially the poor, is one of the most remarkable Australian stories. She remains our only Australian Saint. Yet she was an ordinary person who had deep love for God, deep love for people and a deep love for the poor. Mary believed that education sets a person free and she believed that Catholic children should learn about their Catholic faith through their parents and in school. Although Mary favoured the poor and the marginalised, she welcomed all and she befriended people at different levels of society.

Being part of a Josephite Tradition means to be a welcoming, inclusive, and compassionate community. Mary MacKillop believed that the compassionate love of God was available to all she met. Similarly, Mount Carmel College welcomes and includes all cultures, religious diversity, and socio-economic backgrounds. We continue to promote the core values of compassion, empathy, and dignity amongst our students.

Students on the Primary Campus celebrated our Patron's Feast Day with a Liturgy and engaging in a variety of activities with their buddies.
