Fantastic Year 12 SACE Results for 2024

On behalf of the College community, we congratulate the Year 12 Class of 2024 on their excellent South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) results.

We again had 100% South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) completion rate, as has been the case for many years at Mount Carmel College. More than 99% of all grades awarded were C- or higher and there were no E grades at all.

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Special congratulations to our Dux of 2024, Astin Lu.

Congratulations to the following students who achieved a Merit and will be presented with it in a ceremony at Government House: Benjamin Khuu (Integrated Learning), Zack Nghiem (Research Project), Josipa Pavlovic (Research Project), Sarah Rayan (Research Project).

100% of our students who applied for university received an offer in the first round and of these, just over 83% were offered their first preference.

We are very proud of the outstanding results achieved by our Year 12 students. We know that excellent academic achievements are the result of a lot of hard work and the wonderful partnership in learning between the student, parents, teachers, support staff and the College. Our Year 12 students enthusiastically participated in the many different opportunities open to them through Mount Carmel College.

Building Projects

The Opening of the Carmelite Centre and the Western Technical College Expansion was a very proud day for the College. We were delighted with the number of guests and VIPs who attended including Archbishop Patrick O'Regan, Minister Blair Boyer MP and Dr Neil McGoran, Executive Director of Catholic Education SA. Our students were outstanding as they made visitors feel welcome, the choir were excellent and our student body listened intently to the excellent messages from the speakers. Our Carmelite Centre is a brilliant multi-purpose airconditioned space, for learning, play and recreation. The Expansion of the Western Technical College keeps us at the forefront as the outstanding technical college in the region. The Western Technical College, a campus of Mount Carmel College and located across the street from our Secondary Campus at Rosewater, offers a wide range of courses. Newer courses such as electrotechnology, automotive servicing and plumbing are very popular, whilst traditional favourites such as

building and construction, carpentry, hair and beauty and metal engineering continue to attract strong enrolments.

The students really enjoyed hearing about the stories of the Holocaust survivors and the lesson learnt was that the prejudice and discrimination of the past should help us today and, in the future, to try and prevent some of these things happening again.
